Grassroots Government Activities Committee Chair (GGAC)

The ASHRAE Regina & Saskatoon
Chapters are in continued support for the adoption of an energy code for commercial buildings, as that can contribute to sustainable and energy efficient buildings across Saskatchewan. There have been a few previous meetings with our ASHRAE Regina Chapter and the Saskatchewan Building Inspectors to discuss the ASHRAE 90.1-2010 Standard, and the viability of that standard being adopted as our Saskatchewan energy code for commercial buildings.

ASHRAE Standard 90.1 offers minimum efficiency guidelines for new portions of buildings and their HVAC systems, as well as new systems and equipment in existing buildings and plans for building operation and maintenance. The Province of B.C. has recently adopted the ASHRAE 90.1

Standard for their building inspectors. So discussions are in place for Saskatchewan to follow this lead with the ASHRAE 90.1 Standard requirements commonly being reflected and incorporated into other model energy codes and standards.

Rob Craddock and myself have another meeting scheduled for Wednesday
November 20, 2013 with the Chief Building
Official of Saskatchewan to present some information on ASHRAE 90.1, and continue the discussion to adopt an energy code for commercial buildings. The sense is that this could be a lengthy process for a code to be adopted as the governing bodies would like input for all available and pertinent groups.
But we will keep you updated with any progress and how the meeting goes.

Past President & Research Promotion by Carla Spriggs

At centralized training I learned a little bit about the ASHRAE Foundation. I was not aware that the Foundation existed and I thought maybe I was not alone. So this month I would like to give you some information. The Foundation was started in 1994 to provide perpetual, endowed support for research and scholarships. The foundation has a minimum contribution of \$3,000 to start an endowment but that amount can be spread across three years of \$1,000 donations. The investment earns a set 5% interest annually and is managed by professionals. Every year the 5% earnings are donated into ASHRAE Research in the donor's name and the principal is never touched. After the original \$3,000 endowment is made contributions can be added to it in any denomination you like in the following years. These

endowments have been created as a lasting memorial or honorarium for a donor or as a personal donation and can be set up by an individual, company or group of donors.

I wanted to say thank you to the chapter for purchasing the 50/50 tickets in September. Our chapter was able to donate \$160.00 to the Lynn G. Bellenger \$5,000 endowed scholarship. Lynn Bellenger was the first female ASHRAE President in its 114 year history and her scholarship is for young female Engineering students. I had the pleasure to meet her when she visited our chapter in January of 2011 during her Presidential year and she was an inspirational lady who truly had a passion for engineering.

What's New in ASHRAE

ASHRAE Publishes 2013 Version of IAQ Standard

The 2013 version of ASHRAE's indoor air quality standard contains several revisions to help users better meet its requirements.

Newly published, ANSI/ASHRAE Standard 62.1-2013, *Ventilation for Acceptable Indoor Air Quality*, sets minimum ventilation rates and other requirements for commercial and institutional buildings. The 2013 standard combines the 2010 standard and 10 published addenda to that edition, providing an easy-to-use consolidated standard. Specific information on the contents of each addendum and approval dates for each addendum are included in Informative Appendix J at the end of the standard.

Building Energy Disclosure Session Offered by ASHRAE at AHR Expo

Disclosure requirements and transparency through programs such as fuel efficiency in automobiles and calorie labeling in restaurants have been shown to shift producer and consumer behavior. The same principles are also being applied to building energy use, where energy use reporting and open data impact market behavior and drive energy efficiency. The implications of the growing trend in disclosure policies are examined in a free session offered by ASHRAE at the 2014 AHR Expo. ASHRAE's 2014 Winter Conference takes place Jan. 18-22, 2014, New York City, N.Y. Held in conjunction with the 2014 Winter Conference is the International Air-Conditioning, Heating, Refrigerating Exposition, Jan. 21-23, 2014.

ASHRAE's AHR Expo Session, "Trends in Building Energy Disclosure: Increasing Energy Efficiency without Retrofits," takes place from 3-4 p.m., Tuesday, Jan. 21, in the South Concourse, second level. No badge or ticked required. Attendees will earn 1 NY PDH, 1 AIA Learning Unit and 1 LEED AP credit. Energy disclosure requirements, now required in seven U.S. cities and numerous European Union countries, require periodic reporting of energy consumption for certain buildings.
